Fishing Reports.

Amber Lake Fishout. Bruce F. caught an 18.5 incher; Bill H. and John R. did OK in the afternoon on red-wire chironomids. John R. caught four over 20 inches on Damsel Nymphs. and Dave T. caught a few Glenn Woodhouse caught three fish between 18-19 inches on Amber.

Dave T. said Amber and Coffeepot were OK, but that Deer Springs, West of Coffeepot was over run with vehicles and people even though dirt road was rough and gated.

Bill H. also fished Amber lake in May with Damsels and had one fish about 19 inches on a Damsel Nymph.

Jerry V. and son fished the Smith River in Montana and caught Browns over 20 inches.

Conservation. A. J. reported that Milltown Dam on the Blackfoot is coming out. Glen later found out that the river will be re-routed to enable dredging and removal of heavy metal sediments before the dam is removed.

Cliff S. said the IDFG trapped and tagged 200 wild steelhead on Bear Creek. Cedar Creek, Pine Creek, Little bear Creek and other tributaries of the Potlatch will also be sampled for steelhead smolts.

David Yonge and Don Johnstone fished the Everglades for Tarpon and Snook, even caught some!

Rivers in B,C. designated Special Rivers will have a \$20-25 fee per day for fishing in addition to the fishing license.

May Speakers. Bruce Frazier and Reid Miller highlighted N. Pike and Lake Trout fishing on Mawdsley Lake in N. Saskatchewan. CFC members on this trip in addition to Bruce and Reid included: Debbie B. Bob H., Glen M., Don Johnstone, and Doug Young. Numerous pike were caught, some as large as 42 inches +. A Lake trout caught by Glen coulter was estimated at over 20 pounds.

Crawfish Tube-Fly (From TheFlyBench, Tier: Jason M. Franz)

- 1) Cut a 1 3/8-inch portion of small tube.
- 2) Using a lighter heat up one end of the tube. Then press the hot end against a flat surface, knife or flat piece of metal. This will make a very small lip at one end of the tube. This lip will secure the thread in place and keep it from slipping off the tube after you finish the fly.
- Place the tube in a tube holding tool in your vise with the tube lip where the hook eye would be.
- 4) Tie in thread 1/8 of an inch from the base end of the tube and leave 1/8 bare tube. This is where the hook will be placed using a special plastic sleeve.
- 5) Tie in bucktail for the shell back (carapace) tips first, the butt section should be over the vise.
- 6) Dub a small ball of dubbing.
- 7) Tie on burnt mono eyes.
- 8) Tie on one marabou feather as claws spit the marabou feather with an X wrap to form bunches on either side of the tube. Wrap dubbing over the X warp.
- 9) Tie in soft hackle grizzly feather.
- 10) Dub a football shaped thorax.
- 11) Palmer thorax with grizzly feather.
- 12) Tie on copper wire for ribbing.
- 13) Tie on Antron yarn and advance thread to the tube lip.
- 14) Wrap a smooth abdomen with the Antron yarn.
- 15) Pull the Bucktail over the entire fly and tie off at lip.
- 16) Rib abdomen with copper wire using open winds and tie off fly with whip finish. Cut bucktail to form a small neat tail. Use head cement on the thread to finish the fly.

Hook: Daiichi 1150. 6-8
Tube: Small Diameter, 1/8
Eyes: Burnt Mono
Carapace: Bucktail, Tan

Claws: Marabou, Olive brown

Legs: Grizzly, soft hackle,

natural

Thorax: Scud dub, tan **Abdomen:** Antron yarn, tan **Ribbing:** Copper wire
