Dances With Sharks

Dave Ames is a writer who has spent the last thirty years traveling the world as an itinerant flyfisherman. Fish have nearly killed him, fish have saved his life, and Ames will be presenting "Dances With Sharks," a slide show based on a life in the wilderness, at our March meeting.

Ames' first two books, "True Love and The Woolly Bugger," and "A Good Life Wasted, or Twenty Years as a Fishing Guide," have been described as "Cult classics," and "Perversely informative looks at fly-fishing in several of its most mutant forms." First editions of True Love have become collector's items selling at ten times their original cost, at the show Ames will be signing limited first edition copies of his new book, "Dances With Sharks."

Ames' slide show, like his books, is meant to entertain as well as inform. Fishing is supposed to be fun, and let's face it, fishing is more fun when you catch fish. There's plenty of practical fish-catching information on everything from trout and bonefish to piranha and golden dorado in this compilation of stories, slides and music, and audiences agree this presentation appeals to fishermen and non-fishermen alike.

Speaker Zach Funkhouser gave an informative and entertaining talk on fishing Ascension Bay in Mexico. Trip cost about \$3000 for a week. They stayed in a thatched roof cabin. Meals of fish and other ocean creatures was fabulous. Fish caught were bonefish, tarpon, permit, Barracuda, and various ocean fish. Flies used: Salt water patterns: Crabs, Zonkers, Deceivers, etc.

Zach invited CFC members to join them for a 10 day trip next year the second week in January.

Burgers and Flies History

This event began in 1983 by Joe McGurkin and four of his UI Rugby teammates including Craig Lewis, and Bill Ogle (Bo) that were also fly fisherman. Steve Bush, Dennis Coyle, Kevin Lynott, and Bill Scutter were also early participants. This group wanted to do something for the Special Olympics kids. Joe's brother Larry has Down's Syndrome. "Larry is an inspiration to all he meets and loves flyfishing and camping on the Lochsa, Joe said".

A humble beginning in Joe's house with five people tying and donating flies, the auction netted \$16. By 1984, the event had expanded to 10 people and the auction netted \$50 to \$75. About five years into the event, Dick Wallace joined in with the bribe of a new beer with a carrot on the label. After much searching Joe found the beer with the carrot label "Pacifico". That got Dick there but he could only stay an hour. About midnight he finally left because of the fun and beer??

In the mid 90's LeRoy Hyatt, Dave Engerbretson, and Dave Blinn joined in. The auction began netting around \$1000. It still had a yard sale mentality with old float tubes, fishing gear, flies, and stuff! T-shirts were also a staple in the early years with slogans such as "Check Your Fly at the Door". The event outgrew Joe's home and they moved to Craig Lewis's shop in 1990.

By 2000, Burgers and Flies netted \$3000 a year. The money is used by Special Olympic kids for various needs including uniforms, travel, hotel rooms, etc. to get to the Winter Games usually held in Sandpoint, ID. It remains important to keep the event low key, fun, and without fanfare for participants with a common goal of helping Special Olympic kids of Moscow.

Twenty Three Years and Counting. The fly tying sessions, enjoying the company of fly tyers and others interested in helping the Special Olympic Kids of Moscow, sharing stories, burgers, beer and more continues as this event reached 23 years of age in 2006. Auction proceeds were \$3K in 2006! Perhaps less widely know is that Joe purchases the food, beer, and fishing gear. Some years he may get partially reimbursed if the proceeds exceed \$3K. He and his wife Angie also buy a number of auction items each year. Other unsung hero's include auction recorders, Sylvia Evers in the past and Dauna Lyons in recent years and the numerous tiers, and bidders.

Plan to participate in 2007. You will come away with a good feeling of helping others while participating in a fun event. See you in 2007!









Joe McGurkin was born in West Hartford, Connecticut. He moved to Moscow in 1978. Joe attended the UI and pursued a degree in business. While at the UI, Joe played Rugby for three years. Joe also was a triathlete for 12 years, has completed four marathons and enjoys golf.

He began a career in real estate in 1982 at Moscow Realty, a business that he has owned since 1985. Joe and Angie married in 1991. They have two children, Brandon ,11, and Kennedy-Anne, 8 and Joe and Angie are co-owners of Moscow Realty.

Kids Activities. In addition to being a founder and heading up the Burgers and Flies activities, Joe and wife, Angie sponsor a Wine Tasting-Yard Sale activity to raise money for Elk River kids. The annual Elk River fund raiser is for Arts and Crafts, Theatre, Easter Egg hunts and more for the elk River young people. Joe also currently coaches basketball and football through the Moscow Parks and Recreation Program.

A favorite fishing time for Joe is anytime he can fish with his brother Larry who has Down Syndrome. In fact Joe's favorite fly is a "One Wing Larry" a one-winged foam stone fly that he developed in honor of his brother. This fly really works on the a secret Lochsa hole, Joe's favorite river, on cutthroats, a favorite fish. Another favorite fly is the "Madam-X". Joe also enjoys fishing for rainbows, bass with his mouse patters and big stimulators with rubber legs. He has fished the St Joe since the mid-80's and noted that more rainbows were caught then because of the IDFG stocking program. Elk Creek and Elk Creek Reservoir round out his favorite fishing holes.

First Steelhead. Another of Joe's favorite fishing memories was his first trip to the Clearwater to fish for steelhead with Dear School Principal, Dennis Raciciot. He was a kid from Connecticut that had no idea of what steelhead fishing was all about. He cast out with his spinning rod, hooked, and landed a 20 pound steelhead. What a way to start!

Joe has been a member of CFC since about 1987. He regularly ties "Christmas Pin Flies" for the CFC auction and other events. He frequently brings guests to CFC meetings.

Humanitarian, Mentor. Joe is an outstanding humanitarian, a mentor and supporter of young people, and a conservation minded fisherman. Our community, especially the kids, is "richer" because of Joe and his extended family.

Dave's Hopper

Tying Instruction:

- 1) Tie in thread 1/3 of hook shank from hook eye. Wrap thread back to bend of hook
- 2) Tie on short tail wrapping smooth wraps back to where you began the thread.
- 3) Tie on yellow poly yarn and wrap smooth body back to tail. Form a loop with the poly yarn 1/2 the length of the tail.
- 4) Tie on hackle to be used as rib. Wrap thread back to starting point at hook eye.
- 5) Wrap a smooth body with the poly yarn. Now rib the body with the hackle.
- 6) Tie on a small bunch of deer hair the length of the body.
- 7) Form the wing with the turkey quill over the deer hair.
- 8) Tie a leg on each side of the body. Glue thread that's holding the wing and legs with super glue.
- 9) Form a collar of stacked deer hair and spin a deer hair head.



Preparation of Materials:

Pheasant Tail Legs - Use a Knit Fixer (find at Wal-Mart in the sewing section) to tie a knot in 5 - 7 fibers from a pheasant tail.

Turkey Wing - Cut a segment out of the flight feather from a turkey wing 1 1/2 times the width of the hook gap. Coat the shiny side with Duco cement using your fingers. (Editors note: I have used Spray Shellac with good success too.)

Hackle Rib - Take a long brown hackle and cut along both sides (and bottom if you wish, editors note), leaving only 1/8 inch long barbs.

Hook: Daiichi 1270 # 12 – 14
Thread: Uni-Thread 6/0 Yellow
Tail: Strung Saddle Hackle Red
Rib: Strung Saddle Hackle Brown

Body: Poly Yarn Yellow Under Wing: Deer hair

Wing: Turkey Feather
Legs: Pheasant Tail Legs
Collar: Spun Deer Hair
