## **April Program: Liza Mitchell, Spatial Patterns of Marine-Derived Nutrients in Salmon Spawning**

Management efforts to restore wild salmon runs throughout the Pacific Northwest have typically focused on habitat restoration and improved fish passage. Recent research indicates the importance of other conditions for fish recovery, including productivity and cross-ecosystem subsidies. Productivity in stream ecosystems can be fueled by nutrients that originate from terrestrial, atmospheric and hydrologic pathways, however rarely are marine derived nutrient (MDN) subsidies considered in this context. Spawning activities and remnant carcasses from anadromous salmon provide a pulsed nutrient input into typically oligotrophic headwater streams. Using a paired watershed approach within a wilderness watershed (Big Creek, ID), this study aims to quantify the incorporation of MDN to food webs in headwater streams in the presence and absence of salmon-derived nutrient subsidies

Liza Mitchell is pursuing a M.S. in Water Resources through the interdisciplinary Waters of the West program at the University of Idaho in Moscow. She completed her B.A. in Environmental Science at Colorado College and graduated with honors in 2008. Since then she has worked with watershed conservation nonprofits in Colorado and Alaska doing fieldwork, education and outreach, monitoring and writing. Currently she is researching the impacts of spawning Chinook salmon in the Big Creek watershed, Idaho. Last summer was her first introduction to fly fishing, and she caught a nice rainbow trout on her first day out, and then had a summer-long struggle to balance time between hiking, fishing and conducting field work! This fall she learned to tie flies (thanks to CFC's very own Cliff Swanson) and is awaiting her return to Big Creek next summer to try catching a fish with her own fly.

#### Fly of the Month: Balinderry Olive

Materials:

Hook: DiRiki 740 size 10 2xl

Thread: 6/0 olive

Rib: Brassy size ultra, chartreuse

Thorax: Any dubbing, yellow-green, olive

Hackle: Hen saddle, tan

Wing: Bronze mallard and red dyed golden pheasant tippets



Bob's Notes: Dick Nicklas was tying this interesting pattern at the 2012 FFF Fly Fishing Fair in Spokane, Washington. It is a variation of an old Irish lough (lake) fly. Dick told us that two materials for the fly originally tied by master fly fisher T. J. Hanna are difficult to find legally: thinly dubbed olive seal for body and red swan mixed with bronze mallard for wing fibers. His substitutions are olive thread body with a close woven chartreuse wire rib and mixed bronze mallard and red dyed golden pheasant tippets for wing. The story is that it a great lake fly. So it is fished wet with a floating, sink tip or full sinking line depending on water depth. Let the fly sink and then start a retrieve. I usually start near the bottom and if I hook weeds then I shorten the sink time.

#### **Casting For Recovery Spring Events by Peg Kingery**

Casting for Recovery North Idaho/Eastern Washington is busily preparing for our second retreat in June 2013. Casting for Recovery retreats are offered at **no cost** to all women attending, including lodging, meals, fly fishing instruction and support. These retreats are open to women of all ages and in all stages of treatment and recovery.
