Backcast to November Meeting:

President Roger Willemsen presided at the Clearwater Fly Casters meeting.

Guests: Our guest speaker, Glen Murray and his lovely wife, Iris. Bob and Sandy Garcia. Lawrence Rose, and Tyler Comeau.

Fishing reports: Cliff Swanson and Marc Ratzlaff went fishing last week at the Lochsa and caught big fish. Lynn and Kay Youngblood also fished last week at the Joe before the weather changed; fish rising, figuring out what they wanted was a challenge, but did catch a few 11-15." Tyler Comeau, Coastal Conservation Association CCA member fished the Grand Ronde for steelhead.

Tyler Comeau, VP Washington CCA: Author of a conservation article in Northwest Fly Fishing, November/December 2014. Tyler said most commercial gill netters only make about 15K a year, supplementing their income with logging or other employment. Sport fishing licenses produce much more revenue for the State of Washington than gill netters. There are more fish going over the Bonneville dam now than when it was completed in 1939. CCA is trying to establish a "Hells Canyon" chapter. Dues are only \$25 per year. Members receive the "Tide" magazine and provide support for fisheries legislation as promoted by CCA to benefit both ocean and inland sport fishing.

Committee Reports and Announcements:

Steve Bush

• Encouraged CFC members to join the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA). CCA is very active in reducing gill netting that in turn helps all recreational fishing. It is only \$25 to join for a year.

Lynn Youngblood; Treasurer

• Reported that there is about \$3,500 in the general operating fund and \$5,600 in the scholarship fund. There are 5 calendars remaining for sale at \$10 each. Let Lynn know if you are interested in purchasing one. Dues are now due since our year is associated with the academic year, August - May, not the calendar year. Program Notes:



Program chair, Fred Meyer, welcomed our friend and guest speaker, Glen Murray. A former CFC member, Glen is part owner of Mawdsley Lake Fishing Lodge located in Northern Saskatchewan, Canada. The province of Saskatchewan is known as the "land of living skies," as illustrated by striking photographs taken at the lodge. From the small lichen and fungi to the large animals and birds such as caribou, bear, loons and eagles, nature's beauty abounds. Glen reviewed the catch and release rules of the fish species found at Mawdsley Lake (Northern Pike, Lake Trout and Lake Whitefish). The Haultain River provides habitat for Arctic Grayling. Glen noted that several people have caught Northern Pike 40" long and longer. Glen estimated the 40" pike to be 40-50 years old.

It is approximately 1,200 miles from Moscow to Mawdsley. Glen provided photos of the dining room, bunk house and shower building. The boats are 14' long with 15 hp motors. There are 4 main lakes: Hobson, Marwdsley, East Mawdsley and Haresign Lake. Glen reviewed favored flies and fishing equipment, including steel leaders for those pike!

Clearwater Fly Casters gratefully accepted the gift donated by Glen - 5.5 days of fishing at Mawdsley Lake in 2016 for our next fundraiser auction. This gift includes the fishing and lodging at the Mawdsley Lake, with travel to and from the lodge paid by the successful auction bidder.

Fly of the Month: Damselfly Nymph

Hook – Size 12 Nymph Hook Thread – 8/0 light Brown Weight – Small Lead or Non-Lead wire Tail and Body – Light Brown Marabou Rib – Gold Ultra Fine Wire – the smallest you can find Shell back – Crystal Flashabou

This pattern is a great fly for tiers of all skill levels. It is an easy fly that has very few materials.



The damselfly nymph will swim for only a few feet before resting. When the nymph stops swimming it sinks. As it sinks the body remains level and the tail raises. This fly is design to mimic this resting state. Uses a piece of non-lead weight on the bottom side of the hook shank to work as a basalt so the fly will descend uniformly. The fish will take the nymph as it is settling in the water.
