October Program: Chris Caudill

Department of Fish & Wildlife Sciences, University of Idaho "Snake River Steelhead: Trials and Tribulations of Migration in the Modern World"



Chris Caudill is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Fish and Wildlife Sciences at the University of Idaho. His research interests are in the ecology and evolution of animal movement and the conservation of

aquatic resources. He holds a MS from the University of New Hampshire (1995) and Ph.D. from Cornell University (2002). He conducted postdoctoral research at Georgia Tech before joining the Fish Ecology Research Lab (FERL) at the University of Idaho in 2003 for a second postdoc. He has directed the FERL program since 2008, largely focusing on the migration ecology of adult salmon, Pacific lamprey, and American shad in the Columbia, Snake, and Willamette rivers.

Fly of the Month: Cheeky Mouse

Hook: Size 2-4 TMC 5262 or other long nymph hook

Thread: Gray 3/0

Body: Pine Squirrel zonker strips

Back: Gray 1/4 inch Evazote Sheet Foam

Tail: Ultra-Chenille

Cheeks: Gray 2 mm Cross-Link Sheet Foam

Have you ever wanted to tie a mouse, but did not want to spin deer hair? Deer hair may float like a cork, but it does not resemble the hair of a mouse. Recently, I came across a mouse pattern that is so elegant and simple that I had to learn how to tie it.
