Steelhead data collection, March 1-31 (or until 500 fish have been collected). We need more volunteers to help with steelhead broodstock data collection on the S. Fork Clearwater River. If you ted in assisting with this - go steelhead fishing on the South Fork! We will have trucks driving up and

in which you can put any wild fish you catch. You can keep adipose-clipped fish for your personal use if you wish to do so.

Volunteers to assist IDFG personnel collecting fish from tubes by riding in a truck with hatchery personnel, looking for anglers with fish are needed. We only need 1 volunteer per day for this.

Volunteers are also needed to assist with a study of the potential impacts of air exposure on angler-caught steelhead. We're starting a study to determine if time out of water affects their reproductive success. We can use 2-3 people per day to assist with this work.

Improve Your Casting Skills at the NIFFE By Peg Kingery



Have you ever felt the frustration of watching a hog brown trout slurping emergers just beyond how far you can cast? Or in an eddy on the far side of a fast-moving riffle? Or beneath low-hanging branches? Does your heart race at the thought of hooking a steelhead but all you ever hook is the back of your fishing vest? Or the willows along the river bank?

Plan to attend the North Idaho Fly Fishing Expo (NIFFE) on March 18-19 where workshops and clinics will be held to help you improve your casting skills. Dedicated fly fishers will be

teaching both spey and single-handed techniques for beginning and experienced anglers. The workshops include: Fixing Casting Faults – Single Hand, Beginning Spey Casting, The Double Haul, Tips and Techniques for Longer Spey Lines, and Beginning Fly Casting.

Also of interest for those who have never fly fished is the "Essentials of Fly Fishing" workshop. This workshop will cover the basics of fly fishing (except casting) including: gear, knots, entomology and fishing techniques.

Throat: Yellow Hackle Fibers tied in beard style

Wing: 4 white hackle feathers Cheek: Jungle Cock (optional)

Creator: Jack Gartside **Guest** Tier: Jerry Coviello



The Black Ghost streamer was made in the late 1920s by Herbert Welch, of Mooselookmeguntic, Maine, USA. Today many tiers replace the feather wing with white marabou.
