Scholarships to be awarded:

Clearwater Fly Casters will award \$1,500 scholarships to two recipients. Successful proposals were submitted by **Stacey Feeken**, a U of I graduate student who will study "Distribution and movement of wild and hatchery steelhead: Interactions among populations and overlap with angling effort"; and, Stephanie Estell, also a U of I graduate student, who will examine the life history of a species of caddisfly, *Nectopsyche albida*, which is well known as an important food source for salmonids.

George Hinman, 90, member and strong supporter of the Clearwater Fly Casters and the Federation of Fly Fishers, passed away recently. George was a charter member of the club and served as president in 1978. He loved fishing and fished Rock Creek during its heyday catching over 90 fish on a "rockin and rollin" salmon-fly day. Conservation Committee:

The conservation committee has great concerns about the "Columbia River Policy Review and Next Steps" briefing that took place last and the apparent revisions. The objectives of the policy "are to promote orderly fisheries (particularly in waters in which the states of Washington and Oregon have concurrent jurisdiction), advance the conservation and recovery of wild salmon and steelhead and maintain or enhance the economic well-being and stability of the fishing industry in the state." However, the commission states that "the phase out of gillnet gear for fall Chinook fisheries directed and harvestable up river brights (URBs) has been constrained by the lack of suitable gear alternatives, resulting in the Commission decision to modify the policy to support an additional two years (2017-18) of large gillnet main stem fisheries directed at URB Chinook. CFC members are urged to contact WDFW commission at the website below and express their concerns about this change of policy that directly threaten returns of salmon and steelhead to rivers of eastern Washington and northern Idaho.

Fly of the Month: Muddler Minnow

Materials:

Hook: 2X to 4X long sizes 12 to 1/0

Thread: Red

Tail: Matched slips of Turkey Wing or

Tail Quill

Body: Gold Tinsel – flat or braided

Underwing: Fox Squirrel Tail

Main Wing: Matched slips of Turkey Quill – to

match tail

Collar/Head: Deer Hair – spun and flared –

trimmed to desired shape



Ask most anglers this famous question: "If you could have only one fly to use to catch fish anywhere, anytime and under any conditions, which fly would you choose?"

Many will come up with the same answer: the Muddler Minnow. Whether used in warm or cold, fresh or salt water; no matter if you are out to catch trout, salmon, steelhead, bass, panfish, bonefish and any other species – you name it – the Muddler will catch them all.

Originated in 1937 by Don Gapen, the Muddler Minnow was intended to imitate the ubiquitous Sculpin, and was popularized by Montana fisherman and fly tier Dan Bailey. Designed to suggest large, blocky head and tapered body and tail of the Sculpin, the Muddler has accounted for many fish in most waters around the globe.
