Scholarships:

Clearwater Fly Casters in Collaboration with Kelly Creek Flycasters award Scholarships each year to worthy graduate students from the University of Idaho, Washington State University and Eastern Washington University. Students are invited to submit proposals that are evaluated by club members and scholarships are awarded based on merit and potential benefit to fisheries in the area.

<u>Please note: Applications are due January 19, 2019</u> and at least two awards will be made, the scholarship amounts are to be determined.

Scholarship information:

Any undergraduate or graduate student involved with fisheries research and management, natural resources management, fishing education or other work fostering the knowledge of fishing shall be eligible for this award. Applications will be reviewed by the Clearwater Fly Casters and the Kelly Creek Flycasters for an opportunity to receive a scholarship from one of the clubs.

Required:

- 1. A one-page description of the proposed research project with the contact information for the student.
- 2. A letter of endorsement from the faculty advisor.

The Clearwater Fly Casters Scholarship Fund has awarded \$14,500 in the past 5 years to graduate and undergraduate students in studies of fisheries and fishery management. Past recipients have been from the University of Idaho, Washington State University and Eastern Washington University. Lewis and Clark State College students are also eligible to participate. Research by these students benefits not only fish, but also enhances the economics of the Pacific Northwest.

Conservation Committee:

A meeting on the closure of Idaho's steelhead fishing season is set for 6:00 pm, December 11th in Room 115 of Sacajawea Hall on the Lewis-Clark State College campus in Lewiston. Organized by the Hells Canyon Chapter of Coastal Conservation Association and fishing outfitters and guides, the meeting will be attended by anglers, local business leaders and legislators and cover why the season was halted and steps that can be taken to reopen fishing. Club members are encouraged to attend and express their points of view.

There remains great concern about the "Columbia River Policy Review and Next Steps" issue that is increasingly frustrating due to lack of action and a continued use of non-selective gillnetting on the Columbia River system. Our Conservation Committee Chair Doug Baldwin has attended WDFW meetings regarding this issue and hopefully he will have something positive to report at our December Meeting.

Fly of the Month: "Steelhead Bee"

Originated by noted British Columbia fly fishing author/conservationist/angler Roderick Haig-Brown, the Steelhead Bee was well ahead of its time in many ways. The Bee's design allows it to be fished not only in the traditional upstream drag-free dead-drift dry fly approach, but also cast downstream on a tight line and fished with a "waking" or "skating" technique. Waking flies sit low in the surface and create a disturbance with either wings and/or bodies designed to resist the currents flow. Flies in this category include Harry Lemire's Greased Liner, Bill Bakke's Dragon Fly and Bill McMillan's Steelhead Caddis. Skating flies are tied with traditional stiff, bushy dry-fly hackle intended to lift the fly up



so it rides mainly on the hackle and tail. Traditional dries scaled up in size for steelhead include the Royal Wulff, Humpy, and Hairwing Black Gnat among others. There is a crossover between flies designed as "wakers" being fished as a "skater" and vice-versa. The only thing that matters is if the fish likes the presentation.

Materials:

Hook: Light wire Salmon Dry Fly Hook – Sizes 4 to 10.

Thread: Red.

Tail: Fox Squirrel Tail.

Body: Equal sections of brown, yellow, and brown dubbing.

Wing: Upright divided wings of Fox Squirrel Tail slanted forward at a 45° angle.

Hackle: Brown - stiff dry fly quality or soft wet fly quality – discussed within the instruction.
