February Program: Biennial Auction

The Club's biennial Auction benefitting the club's Scholarship Fund and other activities will be held at our February 2019 monthly meeting.

Auction Highlights:

Live auction will feature fishing related items such as a NRS personal fishing watercraft with oars, three guided fishing trips to either the Grande Ronde, St. Joe, or Clearwater rivers will be offered for bid. Major auction items include rods, reels, fly tying equipment and accessories associated with the sport of fly-fishing. A queen size quilt (see photo below) and a hand crafted with exotic wood inlaid jewelry box (see photo below) will be available. Two-dozen steelhead flies tied by professional tier, Leroy Hyatt, highlight the flies up for bid. A Ducks Unlimited Framed Terry Redlin Print No. 7492/22900, books and framed art will also be available for

competitive bidding. Other items include textile art such as guilted table runners, napkins, woodcrafts, gift baskets, gourmet dinners hosted in homes, and gift certificates.

Silent auction will feature numerous items at three tables that will close bidding in succession during the auction. A variety of items will be found on the silent auction tables such as flowers and chocolates for your Valentine!

Cash and Carry Table The auction will have a "cash and carry table" managed by Marc Ratzlaff to handle many small items on a cash and carry basis, no bidding but prices are negotiable. The club is looking for contributions of small items ranging in value from \$1 to \$10. Items could be old reels in good shape, fly lines not currently being used, some non fly fishing related stuff, fly boxes, and just good saleable small items. The table will also feature fly tying materials, gently used clothing and other miscellaneous items all for cash sale. The plan is to have items marked at very reasonable prices. This is a chance to pick up some fly-fishing gear, fly tying equipment or other needed items. Keep in mind that prices for items at this table are negotiable.

Dues paid CFC members may bring a guest with the guest's dinner compensated by the club. Members bringing a guest should provide the guest's name to Lynn Youngblood.

Scholarships:


Clearwater Fly Casters in Collaboration with Kelly Creek Flycasters award Scholarships each year to worthy graduate students from the University of Idaho, Washington State University and Eastern Washington University. Students are invited to submit proposals that are evaluated by club members and scholarships are awarded based on merit and potential benefit to fisheries in the area.

Conservation Committee:

Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) will hold their annual banquet and auction on March 22nd at the Quality Inn in Clarkston, Washington. Tickets for the event are available from Doug Baldwin and other CCA board members.

CCA has informed us that Washington State Senate Bill 5617 has been introduced to ban the use of non-tribal gillnets statewide. It currently has 24 co-sponsors out of 49 total Senators. This is a HUGE victory for conservation!!! The membership is encouraged to contact their Washington State Senators asking them to support this legislation critical to the survival of Salmon and Steelhead runs on the Columbia, Snake and Clearwater rivers. Please do what you can to urge your Senator to sign onto this bill and show their support for our fish!

Fly of the Month: "Black Nose Dace Bucktail Streamer"

In 1947 Art Flick, an accomplished and inovative fly tyer from the Catskill Region of NY, published his best-known book "Art Flick's Streamside Guide". Here is where the Black Nose Dace Bucktail Stream was first introduced. Art invented the Black Nose Dace Bucktail Streamer to imitate the dace and chubs that lived in the stream. Today this is one of the most popular flies to catch trout and bass with. The Black Nose Dace is a simple fly to learn how to tie and one of the tricks is to keep it sparse. This fly will teach you how to work with Bucktail and Tinsel.



Materials:

Hook: 5X to 7X long shank Hook sizes 4 through 12

Thread: Black 6/0 or 70 Denier

Tail: Red Yarn

Body: Silver Mylar Tinsel

Wing: Brown over Black over White Bucktail
