March Program: Author Dave Hughes will present "Reading Trout Water" at our March 13th meeting. Dave is author of more than 20 books about fly fishing for trout. They include the classic Western Hatches (with Rick Hafele), American Fly Tying Manual, Handbook of Hatches, Reading Trout Water, Wet Flies, Essential Trout Flies, Nymphs for Streams and Stillwaters, and the massive reference Trout Flies. His latest books are



Pocketguide to Western Hatches (published in 2012) and Trout From Small Streams (2014). Born in Astoria, Oregon on the 4th of July, 1945, Dave worked his way through college at jobs specializing in the Three Ds--Dirty, Difficult, and Dangerous: mink ranches, tuna canneries, and shrimp boats. He graduated from the University of Oregon in 1967, from Army Infantry Officer Candidate School in 1968. Dave served one-and-a-half years in Viet Nam, 6 months as a communications site commander in the Mekong Delta, one year as liaison officer to the Commanding General of communications in the Southeast Asia Theater.

Dave was founding president of Oregon Trout in 1983, and was awarded life membership in the Federation of Flyfishers in 1985. He was awarded

the Pete Hidy honorary life membership in the Flyfishers Club of Oregon in 1992 for his literary accomplishments. Dave received the prestigious Letcher Lambuth Angler Craftsman Award in 2008 from the Washington Fly Fishing Club. He is also a life member of his home club, the Rainland Flycasters in Astoria, Oregon.

Dave is an accomplished amateur aquatic entomologist. His hobbies include collecting, identifying, and photographing the aquatic insects that are fed upon by trout, as well as tying and fishing the flies that match those insects and fool those trout. His articles on fly fishing have appeared in Gray's Sporting Journal, Field & Stream, Outdoor Life, Sports Afield, Fly Fisherman, American Angler, Northwest Fly Fishing, and Fly Tyer. Dave served as editor of Flyfishing & Tying Journal for eight years, and is currently a columnist for Fly Rod & Reel and Flyfishing & Tying Journal.

Dave lives in Portland, Oregon with his wife, Japanese fly fishing writer Masako Tani, and their daughter Kosumo.

Scholarships:

Clearwater Fly Casters in Collaboration with Kelly Creek Flycasters award Scholarships each year to worthy graduate students from the University of Idaho, Washington State University and Eastern Washington University. Students are invited to submit proposals that are evaluated by club members and scholarships are awarded based on merit and potential benefit to fisheries in the area.

The club received six scholarship applications and based on a systematic review of applications by the club and the Executive Committee, three 2019 scholarships of \$1500 each will be awarded to:

- **Daniel Auerbach** of Washington State University who will work on monitoring salmon population dynamics
- Moureen Matuha from the University of Idaho who will study optimal spawning, larvae rearing, and
 weaning conditions to improve aquaculture methods for burbot and ensure sustainable production into
 the future
- **John Jorgensen** PhD Student at Washington State University who will work on "Using Food Web Analysis to Evaluate the Success of Stream Restoration Treatments"

The Clearwater Fly Casters Scholarship Fund has awarded \$14,500 in the past 5 years to graduate and undergraduate students in studies of fisheries and fishery management. Research by these students benefits not only fish, but also enhances the economics of the Pacific Northwest.

The scholarship recipients will make short presentations of their work at a future club meeting.

Fly Tying Group:

The group meets regularly and the sessions are open to club members. Just bring your equipment and fly tying materials and join in the fun and camaraderie. Meeting times and venue are announced at our monthly meetings.

Conservation Committee:

Conservation Committee Chair Doug Baldwin reports that SB5617 was introduced as a statewide ban/buyback of non-tribal gillnets on Jan 25th with over half the Washington State Senate signed on as co-sponsors. On Feb. 21st the Senate Natural Resources Committee favorably adopted a substitute bill that limits the non-tribal gillnet ban/buyback to the lower Columbia River and promotes the use of alternative commercial fishing gear capable of selective harvest statewide. We are pleased the committee approved the revised bill but the original bill was set back by Puget Sound Anglers opposition. Legislators expected to see a united front from recreational angling groups, which did not occur, making it too difficult to pass the bill in its original form.

<u>Coastal Conservation Association Banquet:</u> Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) will hold their annual banquet and auction on March 22nd at the Quality Inn in Clarkston, Washington. Tickets for the event are available from Doug Baldwin and other CCA board members.

Fly of the Month: "Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear Nymph"

The Gold Ribbed Hare's Ear Nymph (GRHE) is one of the most popular flies. Easy to tie and the real reason it is popular is that it catches all types of fish.

The GRHE does not imitate one type of fly but gives a suggestion of many kinds of aquatic immature Mayflies. Immature Mayflies are called nymphs and live on the water's bottom waiting to mature and become a mayfly.

Hook: 1X Long 1X Strong hook such as a Daiichi 1560

Thread: Brown 6/0

Tail: Guard Hairs from the Hare's Ear Mask from the cheeks

Abdomen: Hare's Ear Mask Dubbing Fur

Rib: Oval Gold Tinsel

Thorax: Hare's Ear Mask Dubbing fuller than the Abdomen

Wingcase: Turkey Tail Fibers
